LENT IS COMING...



LENT

Historically, Lent was a time of preparation and examination for candidates for entrance into the christian faith through baptism. Candidates learned the faith, and were tested to see if they were worthy. Later, according to Pastor Mary Fairchild. "Lent is the Christian season of preparation before Easter. The Lenten

season is a time when many Christians observe a period of fasting, repentance, moderation, selfdenial and spiritual discipline. The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ-his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial, and resurrection."1

ASH WEDESDAY- February 26, 2020

We start Lent with our Ash Wednesday services at 11am followed by Lunch at noon & 5pm dinner followed by worship at 6pm.

THE BAD NEWS

We will not be having ecumenical worship services around the park this year. With all the transition in our sister congregations we don't have enough churches to make it happen.

We will meet for Dinner at 4:30pm, Worship in the fellowship hall at 5:30 and Education at 6:15 (note time changes).

ADULT ED AT THE MOVIES - 6:15p.m. Wednesdays during Lent

On Wednesday, February 5, at 6pm, we will have a guest speaker Kali Sharot, a Doctoral Nurse Practitioner Student, in Mental Health lead us in a session about Anxiety (What it is, what we can do about it and

when to seek help). This will be for students grades 7-12, parents and anyone else who is interested.

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

January 14, 2020

Present: Aly Kloeckner, Matt Stinson, Mark Jaeger, John Laidlaw, Tom Sasse, Jon Ubbelohde, Kathy Emery, Cyd Mark, Mary Weberg, Pr. Arte Sharot, and Wendy Erickson Devotions and Treats were offered by Jon Ubbelohde.

The meeting was called to order by Kathy Emery, council president.

Agenda: MSC (moved, seconded, carried) to accept as presented.

Secretary's Report: Amended to include motion to designate \$30,000 as housing allowance for Pastor Arte Sharot. This is done yearly and is for tax purposes. MSC as amended.

Treasurer's Report: Aly reported that the finance team recommends a few changes to the budget. These changes will be reflected in the budget presented at the annual meeting. MSC to accept the finance team recommendation.

MSC to accept the treasurer's report and check register.

Staff Reports: Pastor Arte noted a grant available from the Synod for continuing education for \$500. An application will be submitted. The grant will be used for the continuing education provided by Gustavus Adolphus, which is \$500. MSC to apply for grant and use for continuing education. MSC to accept staff reports.

Ministry Team Reports:

Worship and Music: The Christmas Eve attendance at changed service times was reviewed (3:00-173, 4:30-189 and 6:00-60). Two people from FLC will be taking community education class on using soundboards. There will not be any ecumenical Lenten services this year. However, First Lutheran will continue to have weekly Wednesday Lenten services using the Holden Evening Prayer liturgy.

Property: The roof is leaking again (still). Felber Roofing came and checked it out. The railing at the front entrance on West Ave. rusted off at the bottom and was removed. It was MSC to accept the lowest bid and replace it. Plans were designed for remodeling the floor in the music storage room off the altar area. MSC to remodel the room, spending up to \$1000.

Life and Growth: In March, the Life and Growth Committee will be offering personalized cake pans for sale as a fundraiser (probably for new confirmation robes).

Youth and Family: The VBS curriculum has been chosen. Fundraising plans for the mission trips are made, including butter braids, hot dishes and the youth serving the meal on Ash Wednesday. Tina is looking at a curriculum for the high school youth about finances and stewardship.

Christian Action: First Lutheran provided gifts and food for 10 families through the Christmas Project. Funds were also raised to provide food for a family of four for a year with Feed My Starving Children. There has been a request to help with volunteers and/or meals with the homeless project in Red Wing.

Stewardship: no report

Personnel: No specific personnel report but Kathy updated the committee on the names for the nominating committee for 2021.

Old Business:

Big Turn Music Festival: Concerts will be at First Lutheran on 2/21 and 2/22. The committee is working with BTMF staff to determine our need to supply volunteers, electrical needs and other details.

Insurance: There is a policy credit if a church member does some video training and assessments of risk factors. Matt volunteered to do this.

New Business

Republican Eagle: The RE is instituting charges for having the church information listed each week. It was MSC to proceed with the \$150 option as it allows changes to our information as needed and provides more information.

Annual Meeting: The meeting is scheduled for January 26. As usual, the new council will meet immediately after to elect new officers. The next regular meeting of the council is February 11, 2020 and John Laidlaw will provide devotions and treats.


